

# Registering and Un-registering Controls

## If the control has an extension of .exe

To Register:

- 1) Open up a dos prompt by clicking on start > run.
- 2) Type in the command as follows into the open field: **FilePath\NameOfFile.extension /regserver** and then hit enter.
- 3) Example: *c:\windows\system32\mwShEn32.exe /regserver.*

To Un-register:

- 1) Open up a dos prompt by clicking on start > run.
- 2) Type in the command as follows into the open field: **FilePath\NameOfFile.extension /unregserver** and then hit enter.
- 3) Example: *c:\windows\system32\mwShEn32.exe /unregserver.*

## If the control has an extension of .dll or .ocx

To Register:

- 1) Open up a dos prompt by clicking on start > run.
- 2) Type in the command as follows into the open field: **regsvr32 FilePath\NameOfFile.extension** and then hit enter.
- 3) Example: *regsvr32 c:\windows\system32\mwmain32.dll.*

To Un-register:

- 1) Open up a dos prompt by clicking on start > run.
- 2) Type in the command as follows into the open field: **regsvr32 /u FilePath\NameOfFile.extension** and then hit enter.
- 3) Example: *regsvr32 /u c:\windows\system32\mwmain32.dll.*

### **NOTE:**

There are three controls that could possibly cause issues due to newer 32 bit versions that have different names, they are as follows: mwShEn32.exe (old version is mwshrenv.exe), mwMain32.dll (old version is mw-main.dll), and mwLoad32.dll (old version is mw-load.dll). The old version will need to be unregistered and the new version will need to be copied into the system32 folder and registered.
